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Caring For Our Monterra Trees...by Deb LaPlante

It's a fact that trees get big, tall, and eventually die and fall. The cost of cutting down dead and dangerous trees in the greenbelt and open spaces of our neighborhood has been added to our annual expenditures of late. In an effort to preserve and keep our trees safe and healthy for as long as possible, mulching may provide some long-term benefits.

Proper mulching can help improve the health of your soil and your trees. Here are eight reasons to use mulch around trees and in your yard.

- Weed Control
- Moisture Retention To Improve The Soil
- Prevent Soil Erosion
- Nourish Your Plants
- Moderate Soil Temperature
- Protect Beneficial Organisms
- Beautify Your Garden
- Repel Pests

However, if you pile too much mulch or pile it too high around your trees, it is possible to kill a young tree. Here are some guidelines to follow:

Wood chips and fallen leaves are the most popular and easy option for mulch. You can also purchase commercially produced mulch. Spread your chosen mulch in a layer two to four inches thick all around the tree. The mulch should extend to the furthest reaches of the trees canopy. If there are branches above, there should be mulch below. Some tree roots extend two or three times beyond their canopies, so mulching a wider area can help.

Be sure that the tree's root "flare", which is the area at the bottom of the trunk that's slightly wider than the area above it, is NOT covered by mulch. The space between the base of the tree and the mulch should be about two inches.
