Notes From Your Board

Were you at the April meeting of your HOA board? Yes, there was a lot of boring stuff that was discussed, but, mixed in there were things that you, as a homeowner might have wanted to know. You might even have wanted to give the board some feedback.

The most exciting thing being considered is new flooring for the clubhouse. The old floor is very worn, to the point of being dangerous in places. New flooring will complete and compliment the beautiful paint job done by Dorrit Jensen. There is a wide range of flooring available at many different price points. These will be discussed at the next meeting of the board, which is on May 9th at 5:00 PM. This is a major spending issue, so your input is important. Please attend. Also, the next general meeting is on June 7th.

Other financial items that were discussed included the purchase of a new piece of yard equipment, taking down a very tall fir tree near the clubhouse, and which bid to accept for servicing the HOA heaters.

Monterra has a representative government, much like our country. You elect your board and they, in turn, make decisions on your behalf. Board meetings are open for the sake of transparency, so that everyone knows what is being done and how our money is being spent. Things that go on at board meetings affect us all.

Every year at this time, we include a warning here, in the newsletter, about the danger to your pets from mother deer who may attack your dog or cat, and even you, if they feel their fawn is in danger. Every year, another pet or two is attacked, some killed. Please be sure your dog can't get to a new fawn who has been hidden under a bush or in some foliage. They can be hard to spot, but there will be no mistaking the mother as she charges at you or your pet. Stay with your dog outside during this time. Check your yard before letting your dog out. A deer has no trouble jumping a 6 foot fence, so be aware that a baby might be hidden right outside your fence, and the mama might go after your barking dog. Keep your dog on a leash outside of your yard and avoid any areas where a fawn might be hidden. We just don't want to have to report on another dead pet. Or on a mangled, dead fawn. So please.

A Bump In The Road

Starting in early to mid-May, you may notice some bumps across the road at one or both entrances to Monterra. Why, you ask? Clallam County Streets and Utilities Department will be placing speed monitoring equipment near one or both entrances for a period of time. The equipment consists of two pneumatic tubes placed across the road a certain distance apart. When a vehicle drives across the first tube, it generates a signal. Then, when the vehicle drives across the second tube, it generates a second signal. The monitoring system attached to the tubes can determine how long it took the vehicle to get from the first tube to the second tube, and determine how fast the car is going. Once the
