# CBRC Update

# A COVENANT & BYLAW REVIEW COMMITTEE (CBRC) MEETING REPORT

Monterra's CBRC met in open session on January 7th. You can read a complete account of the meeting in the minutes posted at the clubhouse.

The CBRC reviewed the answers to four questions submitted by the Board and the Committee to our legal consultant,

the Condominium Law Group (CLG.) For example, the CLG assured us that it is legal to require any rented property in Monterra to be occupied by at least one person 55 years of age or older.

Then, based on feedback received from the Board and from numerous other homeowners, the CBRC updated its proposals for amending 12 sections of the covenants. For instance, we proposed adding language in Article V Section 5.19 to allow the use of recreational fire pits with spark arresters.

These examples of our work reflect two of the Committee's major aspirations. We wish to propose amendments that both protect Monterra's integrity as an over-55 community and contribute to the quiet enjoyment of our HOA as set forth in our governing documents.

The next CBRC meeting is yet to be announced because the newest version of the proposed covenant amendments is now forwarded to the Board for its consideration. I urge you to stay informed by attending Board and General Meetings, looking for newsletter articles and e-blasts about the CBRC, and talking with your Division Representative or with any CBRC member about the committee's activities.

# SIX FACTORS CONSTITUTING A COMMUNITY

When Sherry and I moved to Monterra, a selling point for me was belonging to a ready-made community where I would immediately share an identity with my neighbors. For me, living here feels different from simply buying a house on a street in town. I offer this article because the six points it makes explain why I'm so content to live here. Do they do the same for you?

1. Geographic Location: The map outside the clubhouse clearly defines Monterra's various divisions, and our entrance sign announces us as a community.

- 2. Shared Resources: Examples are our common property like the greenbelts and the clubhouse.
- 3. Shared Experiences: Don't we all enjoy our quiet neighborhood and the view of the mountains?
- 4. Common Concerns: How about bluff safety and covenant revisions?
- 5. Social Unity: This includes fun stuff like potlucks and ice cream socials.
- 6. Mutual Support: Some of us mow the open areas for the rest of us, and others prepare our HOA for emergencies.

Think of your own examples of these six factors and talk them up with each other. I believe it will strengthen us as a community.
