# Greenbelt Safety

Many of us love to go to the greenbelt areas here in Monterra and watch the sunsets, wildlife, and ships in the channel. It is one of the pleasures of living here.

Bluffs are subject to erosion, and large sections of bluff can fall off without warning. That is the reason that the bluff edge has been roped off and signs erected warning of the dangers.

Unfortunately, recently we have had a number of residents who have ventured beyond the ropes and the signs that state "Danger Bluff Erosion, Stay Back, Keep Out, No Trespassing Beyond This Sign", or have removed or damaged the ropes or signage. Others have been told that it was OK for them to go beyond the ropes to trim grass on the bluff.

Please note Article V, Section 1.7 of our Bylaws states: "All MHA Greenbelt Areas and facilities are managed by the Association. Members must receive

Board approval prior to making any changes to any Greenbelt property /facilities/signage or not abiding by the signage requirements. Failure to obtain authorization from the Board will result in a \$250 fine."

The Bluff Committee is working with various state and local officials, and hope to provide updated guidance and recommendations in the near future, and will share them with the Board and once finalized, the community. In the interim, please abide by our bylaws and signage unless you have obtained prior written consent from the entire Board of Directors, and do not take any actions that would result in the HOA having to impose fines, or even limit or restrict access to the greenbelt areas for everyone. Thank you.
