Weather Alerts

With high winds for Western Washington and snow in the mountains becoming more regular, it is a good time to stock up on supplies, prepare your emergency kits for your cars and get ready for potential power outages at your homes (which we have already experienced), especially if you live in Western Washington. Find your local forecast at weather.gov and download emergency kit information at mil.wa.gov/kits

Build Your Emergency Food Supply

If we have an emergency such as an earthquake or bad winter storm, experts say you should have at least a 7-day supply of food and water that is shelf-stable (long-lasting), easy to prepare and stored in a safe container that will protect it from moisture, rodents, etc.

In an emergency, we will likely lose power, so most of the foods should be ones that can be eaten as-is or easily prepared, such as by just adding water. Protein-rich foods are very important to help you feel full and satisfied.

There are emergency food kits you can purchase, or build your own. Building your own will help make sure you have foods you would want to eat, and will likely be less expensive than purchasing a ready-made kit. You can buy a few items with each grocery shopping trip so it won't be a big expense all at once.

Here are some suggestions for items to keep in your Emergency Food Supply.

- **Water:** You will need at least 1 gallon of water per day per person for drinking and meal prep.
- Single-serve instant oatmeal or dry cereal
- Dry milk
- Dried fruit, individual applesauce or fruit cups
- Protein bars
- Tuna & cracker snack packs
- Canned or pouched tuna and chicken
- Peanut butter
- Canned beef stew
- Canned chili
- Canned pasta with meat
- Canned refried or other beans
- Canned soup
- Instant Ramen soup
- Ready to eat macaroni and cheese
- Pouches of ready to eat rice
- Pouches of instant mashed potatoes
- Crackers
- Trail mix or your other favorite snack
- Seasonings (salt, pepper)
- Water flavor packets to help you enjoy staying hydrated. Consider those with minerals and electrolytes.
- Hard candies or some other comfort food that has a long life.
- Disposable napkins, utensils, plates or bowls,
- Can opener (if the canned foods you have aren't pull tab)
- Wipes
- Small pot.
- If possible, a heat source such as a camp stove or sterno, or see if you have a burner on your gas grill.

Once a year, check your food supply and rotate out food that is going to expire, eat it, and replace. And don't forget your pets!
